## Message from David Watson, Musical Director, Phoenix Brass

I am pleased to be able to write to you in this edition of the Phoenix Flame. I do apologise for the absence of a Flame since the start of the year, but you are now treated to a bumper edition to make up for it!

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your get-well messages during the first few months of the year. It all seems a bit of a blur now, but I was in and out of hospital and feeling so unwell. I am pleased to say that I am better but, as they say, old age creeps up on everyone!

During my absence, I would like to thank Anthony (Tug) for looking after the weekly rehearsals in my absence. I know that it was a constant rush from work, often travelling back from the far reaches of the southwest, necessitating a quick turnaround to make rehearsals. ### 2024 Membership

As many of you will be aware by now, Phoenix Brass is an autonomous organisation and is completely self-financing. It receives no sponsorship or other funding.

Phoenix Brass is funded mainly by player subscriptions, fundraising which includes concerts, other fee-paying engagements, coffee mornings, public donations, and membership subscriptions from the Friends of Phoenix. As with any organisation, Phoenix Brass has to meet various costs to keep the band running and functioning as effectively as possible.

Costs include instruments (including the purchase and maintenance), uniforms, music, materials, and administrative costs, hire of the band-room and insurance.

Phoenix Brass has a wonderful audience following and many have become loyal supporters. The supporters' organisation, Friends of Phoenix, was formed in 1994. With a membership that includes parents, relatives, friends, and enthusiastic listeners, they have supported the band in every possible way.

This highly enthusiastic support group has provided fundraising, refreshments for concerts, transport for players and has organised social events for Band members.

The Friends of Phoenix membership fee supports the band as above. The annual fee is just £5.00 per person which, I am sure you will agree, is extremely good value.

Unfortunately, during the past two years, membership numbers have declined considerably, due to some of our 'Friends' no longer being with us, but also many not renewing their membership.

I would kindly ask you to reconsider joining the Friends of Phoenix or, indeed, pass on the details to anyone you know who would like to support the band. It is only £5 a year!

The opportunity has been taken to include a Membership Form, and also a Standing Order Form as we offer the ability to pay the annual subscription by Standing Order.

# Phoenix Brass in Pictures

The start of 2024 seems a long time ago now, with the current summer, sun and heat.

Back in February 2024, residents at **Merlin Court Care Home, Marlborough**, which provides residential, respite and dementia care, welcomed players from Phoenix Brass Band. Residents and care home staff gathered, anticipating an afternoon of musical delight.

The residents had a lovely afternoon with the band and very much enjoyed the music. The band played something for everybody from military marches to easy listening and pop and songs from the 'Sound of Music', bringing back memories for many.

Anthony Palmer (Tug), who conducted the band in the absence of David Watson, Musical Director, due to illness, said "It was lovely to play to residents at Merlin Court because we were able to take brass music to people who cannot otherwise go out to listen".

One Resident said, "It was absolutely beautiful" whilst another asked, "When is the band coming back?"



In May 2024, Phoenix Brass held their **Annual Awards Evening** at the Royal British Legion in Hungerford. The event was different this year in so far as the format of the evening was a buffet, allowing players the opportunity to socialise and mingle before the presentation of the awards, followed by dancing. Musical Director, Mr Watson, announced the awards and presented the trophies:

**Musical Director's Award** – Presented to Roy Mason for his contribution and support as a volunteer, helping with an assortment of jobs at Froxfield War Memorial Hall.

**George Edwards Award** – Presented to Eloise Brooks, Principal Cornet. 2023 was a rather tough year with many changes on the front row cornet section making the role as Principal Cornet challenging. The award recognised her dedication to the band and the support she gave David Watson.

**Nora Edwards Memorial Award** – Presented jointly to Brian Williams (EEb) and Steve Hutchins (BBb), two players from the bass section for their continued commitment and support over the years.

**Musician of the Year Award** – Anthony (Tug) Palmer, for his dedication and support in taking band rehearsals and engagements since the start of the year whilst David Watson was unwell.

**Young Musician of the Year Award** – Samuel Parkin, in recognition of his training, learning and ability throughout the past year on percussion, supporting the band at several engagements.

**Friends of Phoenix Award** – Ruth Roberts. In her absence, presented to her son, Carl Roberts, bass player. Ruth is a member of Friends of Phoenix who has provided invaluable support, preparing and presenting numerous hampers as prizes for the Band Summer and Christmas Raffle Draws over the past few years.



6 June 2024 marked the **80th Anniversary of Operation Overlord**, which saw tens of thousands of soldiers embark from Portsmouth to cross the Channel, establishing a foothold across the French coast in order to begin the advance to liberate northwest Europe. Players from Phoenix Brass recently performed at two D-Day themed events.

On Thursday, 6 June 2024, the band played 1940's music at the D-Day evening event arranged by the Parish Council at Milton Lilbourne Village Hall.

This was followed by the lighting of a beacon, just one of the thousand beacons lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands and UK Overseas Territories to commemorate the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, France, and to pay tribute to those who contributed to the liberation of north-west Europe from Nazi occupation.

On Saturday, 8 June 2024, players travelled to Chaddleworth and performed at the village fete, which this year commemorated the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D-Day.



In July 2024, a small group played at the **Milton Lilbourne Summer Fete and Dog Show** in the grounds of the village hall. The event raised funds for the Wiltshire Air Ambulance.



Also in July 2024, and protected from the frequent and heavy downpours, players performed on a trailer at the **Lambourn Vintage Machinery Society Show** at Lambourn Woodlands. The Show is normally held in May, but the ground was so waterlogged from the heavy rains, so delayed until July.

In mid-July 2024, Phoenix Brass returned to play at the **Bandstand in Victoria Park, Newbury** as part of the summer season of events. Passing shoppers, families who had come to play in the park and those who had chosen to spend a typical quintessential afternoon listening to the brass band gathered, some sitting in the hot afternoon sun, to relax and listen to a varied programme of musical pieces carefully chosen by Musical Director, David Watson.

The audience was treated to two solo performances. The first by Chris Cowlan on flugel performing his own arrangement of 'Concierto de Aranjuez,' better known as 'Orange Juice.'


The second by Anthony "Tug" Palmer on solo cornet who played "Let Me Try Again" by Frank Sinatra, written by Caravelli.





In late July 2024, Phoenix Brass played over the two-day **Market Lavington Vintage Meet** held during the weekend of 20 and 21 July. The event proved to be a tremendous success among exhibitors and visitors alike, attracting hundreds to the village and helping to raise funds for Wiltshire Air Ambulance and local projects.

Playing near the main refreshment area, the musicians entertained families and visitors at this extremely successful show.



At the end of July 2024, Phoenix Brass played for the residents of **Bayford House Care Home in Stockcross**. The residents were joined by families and friends, and they all had an enjoyable afternoon, sitting in the afternoon sun listening to a mixed repertoire of music. During the interval, teas and cold drinks were accompanied by home-made cakes.



In May 2024, the Band received a request “to provide a sort of mini version of yourselves for a 90th birthday party here in the garden on 4th August. Only about 40 people but we have done things like this before with a background band and it would be lovely if it worked”

So, a small band comprising just 15 players performed at the **Private 90th Birthday Party** close to Marlborough.

The mixed musical repertoire received much applause from the family, relations, and guests, who complemented the players for their excellent playing and for providing the right ambience and backcloth to the birthday event.

The band performed ‘Happy Birthday’ and ‘Congratulations’ before David handed over a card to the ‘birthday girl’ from everyone in Phoenix Brass.



### Instrument Care!



As players will know to their cost, instrument care is paramount.
